DIFFERENT BOWLS EACH SCHOOL HAS APPEARED

Below we have listed all 120 NCAA Division I Football Bowl Subdivision schools and the number of different bowls each has played in. If a bowl has changed titles, stadium site or the actual name of the bowl game, it still counts as the same bowl. An example of this is the Capital One Bowl. It was known as the Tangerine Bowl (1947-1982), the Florida Citrus Bowl (1994-2000) before becoming the Capital One Bowl in 2001. The current Champs Sports Bowl (1990-2009) was also known as the Tangerine Bowl from 2001-2003 which adds to some confusion.
